



Crafts and Activities	What to do

The cross is centered on a light blue background.	<p>On your daily walk/ cycle /scoot pick up a couple of sticks and make a cross tying them together with string, wool, cotton or a pipecleaner .</p> <p>The one in the photo fits on an A4 piece of paper to give you an idea of size.</p> <p>There are lots of twigs and branches in the churchyard near the bee garden!</p>

	<p>Have a go at making this Holy Week to eat.</p> <p>The base is piece of buttered bread The donkey is chocolate. The cross is a biscuit (I think) There are seeds as nails Red and black food gel</p>
	<p>Use any paper that you have at home and create a picture of the empty tomb like the one in the picture. If you have a stone which can be moved, you will be able to open the tomb during the service when we re-tell the story of Easter morning.</p>
	<p>Easter Egg Hunt Don't forget to find the six paper eggs before the service starts as you will need these for Andrew's talk.</p>
