Blackbird 	Blue tit 	Chaffinch 
Love eating seeds and suet from the ground. Also enjoy apples and will happily peck at cores that you put out for them	Love to eat seeds and suet from bird feeders	Often found in beech trees but will also eat seeds in bird feeders or on the ground
Goldfinch 	Great tit 	House sparrow 
Love sunflower hearts and nyger seeds – eat from bird feeders	Like blue tits, they love to eat seeds and suet from bird feeders	These noisy birds love to hang out in big groups and will happily feed on the ground or from feeders
Robin 	Starling 	Wren 
Robins only tolerate other robins during the mating season but offer them live mealworms and they may come and feed from your hand	These noisy birds are often found in very large groups and will happily eat from the ground and feeders	These shy birds are difficult to spot. They feed mainly on insects and you rarely see them feeding in the open
